Here are our plans for 2024, that hopefully address points raised in the recent survey.

Coaching

As Alex mentioned we were sad to have Natalie Hardy leave the coaching team. She is still a member and will be helping the Ladies teams this year. We have already benefitted from excellent coaching in team practice. As there have been a few changes recently, when the winter months are over, we want to have an event where we try and get all the coaches and members together, so members can meet them and find out more about them. I have updated the website, there are still more updates to make. We want to also try and get new members (junior and adult) from outside of Hampton village. I've approached the Meriden Parish Council asking if we could do something there, with a view to getting more to join the club. The membership list has just a handful of members living in Meriden, so there is great potential for new members there.

Chances to play competitively

We will run the Club Championship again this year. That is a tournament open to all members. We also want to run the Challenger tournament. We also want to hold a number of American Doubles tournaments like we did last year. Last year we had one on Hampton Festival day and another one later in the season. We learned a lot about what works and what doesn't work so well. One area we can and must improve on is the Junior tournament. Now that the Coaching team is now in place we hope that generates more interest and participation in the tournaments. We continue to run box leagues throughout the year. We've moved over to the LTA competitions system, which has some annoyances, but looks to be working. We would like to explore the possibility of a Junior box league. Team Tennis continues with 4 ladies teams and 4 men's teams. We will communicate better how team selections are made soon.

Social Events

We don't have a social events part of the committee, meaning more work for those on the committee. More volunteers are always welcome! We will commit to organising a couple of Social events during the year. It would be nice to have another End of Season Party. Something like that takes a lot of organising so we can't say for definite that will happen.

Communication

These are our plans. We will communicate these plans in the near future. One of the things we have become aware of is that people want to know what's going on, but don't want to be bombarded with too many emails.
